the rugby itself, even though we've tried to get him to do rugby coaching courses.

"But he's been our fitness coach for many years. The lads really enjoy his sessions and the fitness levels are a tribute to Ian.

"I'm delighted for our other coaches, Dave Manion, Thomas Leelock and Andrew Neale because we are just so fortunate to have these guys in our coaching team."

Victory was never in doubt as, led by Neil McClure's try, six conversions and a penalty, H&F were 38-0 up before their rivals registered a

Porter-Griffiths heaped praise on his full back and insisted that, regardless of the try scorers, every man in the squad played a full part in the triumph.

He said: "Neil is a very good kicker and I'm just surprised we didn't find him sooner.

"We have played total rugby in winning this league with the forwards securing the amount of ball which allows the backs to run.
